7 Principles:

"We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote:

- 1. <u>1st Principle</u>: The inherent worth and dignity of every person;
- 1. <u>2nd Principle</u>: Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;
- 1. <u>3rd Principle</u>: Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- 1. 4th Principle: A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;
- 1. <u>5th Principle</u>: The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- 1. <u>6th Principle</u>: The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- 1. <u>7th Principle</u>: Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

7 Principles, simple version:

1st Principle: We believe that each and every person is important.

<u>2nd Principle</u>: We believe that all people should be treated fairly and kindly.

3rd Principle: We believe that we should accept one another and keep on learning together.

4th Principle: We believe that each person must be free to search for what is true and right in life.

<u>5th Principle</u>: We believe that all persons should have a vote about the things that concern them.

6th Principle: We believe in working for a peaceful, fair, and free world.

<u>7th Principle</u>: We believe in caring for our planet Earth, the home we share with all living things.

7 Principles in Spanish
